# Aims of G-I-N

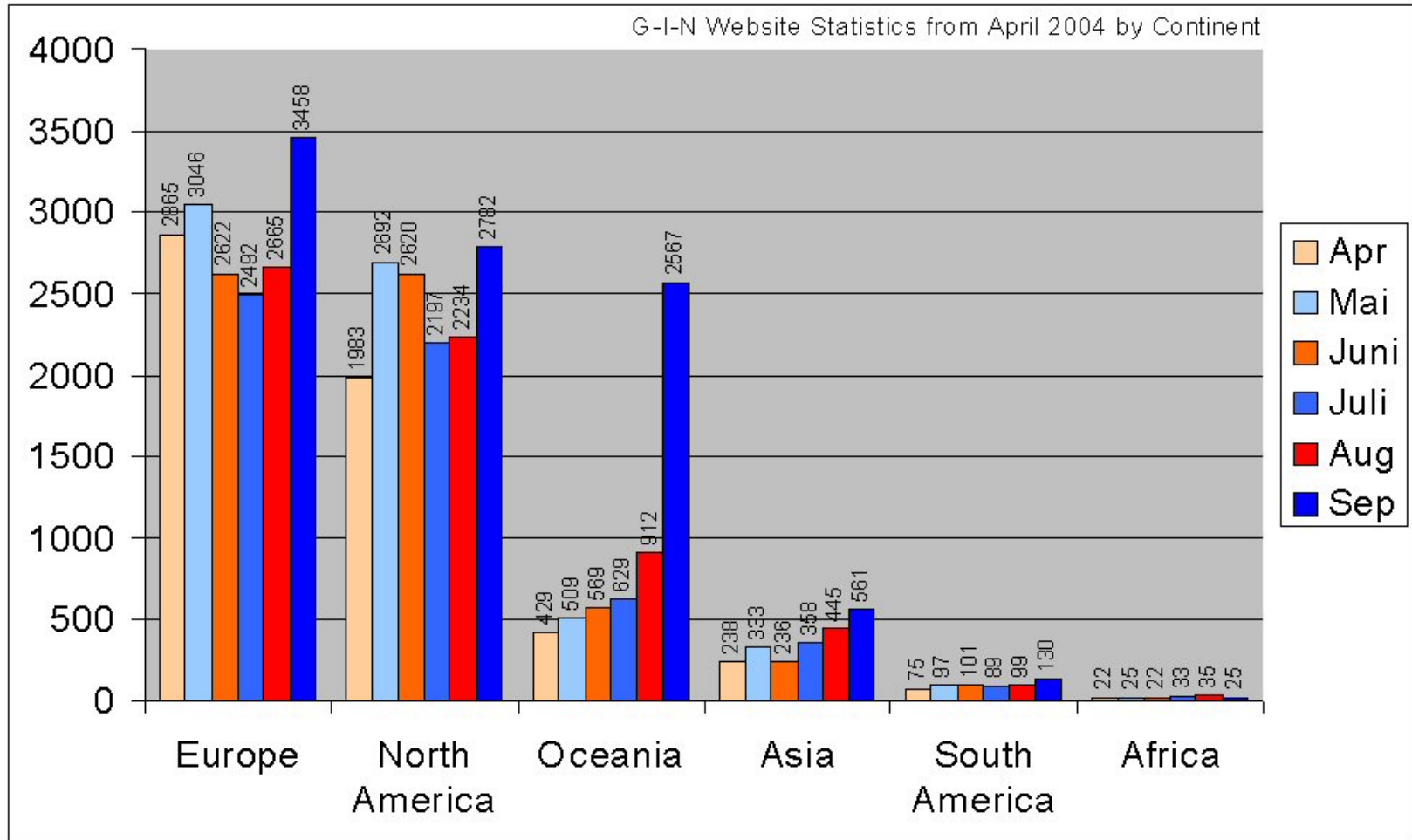
- **International collaboration**
